

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Four essay questions
- Letter of Recommendation
- Resume/CV

Online Application

- Draft your essays on your computer. Then paste them in the online portal.
- Create a user name and password, to go into your application as often as you would like.
- Trust, but verify ask for editing help.

WHERE DO I BEGIN? HERE'S SOME ADVICE...

- Write in your own voice be you!
 - ABFE and the selection committee wants to get to know the real you.
 - Avoid jargon and "philanthrop—ese".
 - Great books by Tony Proscio: In Other Words; Bad Words for Good; When Words Fail. FREE: http://www.comnetwork.org/2010/08/jargon-books/
 - Tell your story.
- Sounding Board Talk to your recommender about why you want the Fellowship
 - Help craft your recommendation, let your recommender know what is important to you.
- Find examples of Leadership in your work experience/stories
 - Don't be afraid to "toot your own horn".
 - Push for the results and outcomes YOU want.
 - Self-advocacy isn't a crime.





CLFP OBJECTIVES - FROM OUR COACH

Operating Definition

- -- Leadership is an action, not a position
- -- Anyone can lead at any time, anywhere
- -- It starts with you and must engage others
- --Your purpose must be clear
- --It is risky
- -- Leadership is morally/ethically neutral; we have to choose positive, ethical, authentic leadership
